However, Electricity is not available. We have reservations, at the restaurant, for Saturday, March 31 at 6:00PM. Please sign up on the white board at the Club or Email me at cctex2000@aol.com. Going by car, head over the Harbor Bridge and take Texas 35 to Aransas Pass. Take 35Br north out of Aransas Pass. City by the Sea is just North of Aransas Pass. Once you are in City by the Sea, the Crab-"N" restaurant will be on the East side of the Highway.

Going by boat, head out over Corpus Christi Bay to Ingleside. Head North up the ICW. At Marker 72 turn West into the channel and bear left then right. The Crab-"N" dock is all the way at the end of the channel. Caution, if your mast height is greater than 48', you will not be able to get under the Aransas Pass Bridge over the ICW. You will have to take the alternate ICW route by going to Port Aransas and back to ICW on the other side of the bridge. Hope we have some good winds on this Cruise.






